Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974, also known as the Buckley Amendment, is a federal law that protects the privacy of a student's educational record. FERPA applies to all educational institutions receiving funds from the United States Department of Education, from kindergarten through university level.

As part of University Compliance's FERPA campaign, all University staff that have access to student records are required to complete the online FERPA basic course. Once you complete the course, you will receive a completion certificate that you will present to the faculty you're working with.


